




#### **The Dunny Report**

#### **Camping Hint**

Take a 'P' bucket camping for night use, especially when it is freezing weather.

**Hint-**make sure it has a good seal on the lid. It's not good if it gets kicked over during the night!!



#### **Camping Toilet Etiquette**

We were so excited about going away on our clubs first big camping trip to the Simpson Desert. It was a new experience for most of the group, but we were well prepared and we had a fantastic experienced leader – Murray. He taught

us lots of things on that trip that will stay with me forever. One was toilet etiquette.



Out bush, there can be a problem with dingoes or foxes digging up our toilet sites. They are attracted to our poop. As they dig up the soft earth, toilet paper gets spread everywhere, which is an eyesore, and very unpleasant for others camping after us.

#### Remedy

Dig a hole as deep as you can, but put your toilet seat next to the hole. Do your business, and then put spent toilet paper into the hole.



Cover the paper with a small amount of soil, and then push "the business" into the hole with shovel. Cover with remaining soil.

This method also means the stool is stable while seated, as it can become a problem if the hole is too big.

In the past, it was recommended that you burn the paper, but this has caused bush fires if the wind picks up the burning paper. Not a good practise!

#### Overcoming unstable toilet seats

Attach two pieces of timber to the base of the stool frame. This helps balance while preventing the legs sinking into the soft sand.

Set up toilet seat near a bush. Then hang on tight!

to hold on for balance.


On some occasions, groups have set up a communal

This overcomes the problems of numerous soiled places around favourite camp grounds. A pop-up shower/toilet tent is very quick and easy to erect. A hole is dug as deep as possible using a folding box type toilet seat and then filled in before leaving the site.
