



of Kangaroo and Trout. Time for more wineries, Saltrams at Angaston, then viewed Mengler's Hill to show our American tourists who were only in Australia for 13 days. Talked Colin into



visiting Bethany Wines set in an old quarry but once again checked if there was plenty of room for our purchases. Chaetau Dorrien intrigued our tourists with the murals on old concrete wine tanks and of course

more tastings. Whistler Wines have a lovely garden setting together with their nice wines and then last of all, just before 5.00pm we tried Two Hands at Marananga which only opened about 7 months ago. 7 wineries all up and we could still both walk out the vehicle sober – amazing!!! Lived in the Barossa Valley most of our lives and never experienced a winery tour. We want to go again (but do we have to wait for another raffle prize to go??)

Trip Reports

The Five Ferry Run Sunday, 13/3/2011

The day began in the dark with the expectation of showers, however, it turned out to be a fine and bright day. We met the group of Nick, Kerrie & Kaleb, Bronte, Norma & Wayne, Joann & Peter, John & Astrid, Marie, Peter & Sandra, Brent & Keryn, Martin (on his motorbike) & Bronwyn & Roy at the Institute Park in Mt Pleasant and set off to explore the Murray River and five of its ferries (no Wayne & Brent; ferries not fairies).

We meandered on the black top through Sedan to the first ferry at Swan Reach and it was here that Quenton explained one of the side activities

Every March thousands of people shave, colour and wax their hair to raise funds for the Leukaemia Foundation. It's one of Australia's biggest fundraising events, it's also the most fun!

Every hour, someone in Australia is diagnosed with leukaemia, lymphoma or myeloma. Every two hours, someone dies from one of these blood cancers. Almost 10,000 Australians will be diagnosed with blood cancers and related blood disorders this year. Although survival rates are improving, blood cancer is our second biggest cause of cancer death. In 2010 it is projected that:

more than 4,700 Australians will be diagnosed with lymphoma; more than 3,200 Australians will be diagnosed with leukaemia; more than 1,500 Australians will be diagnosed with myeloma.

The Leukaemia Foundation receives no ongoing government funding, so supporting this event makes our Vision to Cure and Mission to Care possible.
