Hi all,

OPENING OF THE SA POLICE "ROAD SAFETY" CENTRE

As you may be aware I have been attending your monthly 4wd club meetings throughout South Australia for the last few years with the main aim being to educate members on 4wd modification, fatigue / long distance driving and loads / restraints on & in vehicles. These lectures have been very well received and I thank you for your continued support in helping SAPOL to promote road safety.

The reason for my email to you today though is to advise of the opening of the SA Police 'Road Safety Centre' situated at the Thebarton Police Barracks on the corner of Port Rd and Gaol Rd, Thebarton. In 2013 our aim is to have as many 4wd clubs as possible attend our centre during the months of April, May, June and July in order to help promote and be educated on all manner of road safety issues that may affect or be of interest to your members. What we envisage offering to 4wd clubs is the opportunity for your club to attend the Road Safety Centre – either as part of your monthly meetings or as a separate 'event' held by clubs whereby your members can attend our centre on a given evening or weekend.

Could you please canvas your members during your next meeting to enquire if they would be interested in this offer? Depending on what your members suggest we are guessing that the evening would go along as follows:

6.30 / 7.00 pm arrival at Thebarton Barracks for a self-catered BBQ dinner (if interested as we have all facilities to cook etc).

7.30 pm start your monthly meeting

Christmas Show Mannum Caravan Park






Another great Christmas breakup on the Murray River.

Next on the list was the visit from Father Christmas & as usual some kids love him & some kids are just not sure who this white frizzed hair man is!!!!!!!!!!!!


But, boy, did he hand out some good presents.

THE FOLLOWING APPLIES TO ALL OF US 4 WHEEL DRIVERS AND IS WORTH A READ;

SAPOL: 4WD MODIFICATION AND THE LAW

Notes from presentation on 14 September 2012 conducted by Senior Constable First Class Paul Bryan, Road Safety Educator

Subjects covered: Road Safety, 4WD/Towing, 4WD Modifications and Loads; Insurance

5 Main reasons for crashes:

- 1. Seatbelts not being worn
- 2. Speeding – generally not an issue for 4WD vehicles
- 3. Distractions - GPS, Mobile phones, etc.
- 4. Drink/Drug Driving
- 5. Dangerous road users

Hazardous projections:

- Additional side or towing mirrors The law is that they be removed after towing. 1.
- 2. Fishing Rod holders on bullbars are illegal – danger to pedestrians
- Radio aerials fitted to bullbars, eg "L" bracket should be facing rear of vehicle 3.
- 4. Towbar hitches to be removed after towing – can cause injuries

Commonsense re 4WD accessories

Large HF aerials should be mounted onto rear of vehicle so as not to impede driver's vision.

Fuel containers may be carried on rear of vehicle generally as high as possible.

High Lift kits – 50mm is legal in SA – that is body and springs in total. Approval by DPTI (old Transport SA) if greater than 50mm applies. Requires engineering report and approval, eg Lane change test, etc, by a professional engineer. Then final inspection and on road approval by Regency Park and copy of exemption needs to be kept in glove box.

Eyebrow Height

Centre of rim to base of wheel arch moulding. Bridgestone Tyres have height measurements available for all makes and models.

Tyre sizes

Only 15mm above the largest dimension noted on tyre placard usually in glove box of the vehicle is allowable. If any greater than 15mm an engineers report is required.

Wide Tyres

Refer to Universal Tyre Guide – available on internet, tyre dealer and vehicle tyre placard.

Driving Lights

Should be in multiples of 2 or 4 and it is illegal to mount on roof racks. Rear work lights only to be used when stationary and wired independently of high beam and reverse lights. LED lights may be mounted on front bull bar in pairs.

Comprehensive Insurance implications

Owner must notify insurance company re any modifications carried out to vehicle. If a modification is a major factor in an accident, Police will be involved and insurance could be void.

CTP insurance

Will not cover the following: driving under the influence, driving an unroadworthy vehicle, intentionally causing injury or death, having an overloaded vehicle, driving in an unsafe manner (refer to document you

Ensure kerb weight of vehicle is measured correctly, ie unloaded vehicle but including full tank of fuel and all other accessories such as bullbar, roof-rack, cargo barrier, drawer system and fridge.

Safety Chains and Shackles

Rated "D" shackles are the preferred option.

Finally, a quick calculation of the GVM minus the Tare Weight (including any towball weight, eg usually 10% of trailer weight) may indicate a very limited amount of load you may carry in your 4WD. Any figure which the GVM exceeds would indicate an overloaded vehicle. Insurance issues may be encountered.

will receive with your annual registration renewal.) 4WD loading/ball weights/towing

As we take our long summer break and head out into the great outdoors to enjoy the many splendours this wonderful country has to offer, it's worth considering the following points (RAA's Summer Edition 2012-13 of the SA Motor magazine):

The article is entitled "Tow the Line" where they look at the laws & penalties surrounding towing in this State

1. **Before you set off**, check if your car is able to legally carry the weight of your trailer or caravan. S A law says the load cannot exceed the towing capacity of the vehicle or towbar – as specified by the respective manufacturers. If either does not list these specifications, contact RAA's Technical Advisory Service on 8202 4689 for more details.

Penalty: Maximum fine of \$2500

- 2. **The mechanics** Pulling a load puts more stress on your vehicle; check your oil and coolant levels and tyre pressure before and during your trip.
 - Tip: Towing is also more exhausting on the body and mind than ordinary driving so try to avoid long trips in one go or driving without a break and share the driving if possible.
- 3. **No stop Zone** Except if in a built up area, it is illegal to pull over in a long vehicle unless you stop on the shoulder of a road. In a built-up area you cannot stop a long vehicle for more than an hour unless otherwise indicated.

Penalty: \$101 fine plus \$60 Victims of Crime Levy and one demerit point.

4. **Up front** – No person can be in or on the trailer while you are driving. All passengers must be seated and restrained properly in the cabin of your vehicle.

Penalty: \$210 fine plus \$60 Victims of Crime Levy and one demerit point.

- 5. **Looking around** Extra loads can affect your rear vision. Consider getting extensions for your side view mirrors so you can see all traffic behind you, as well as in front.

 Tip: Also make sure you take more care to accelerate and brake smoothly, and to ease into turns, in order to reduce the sway of your load.
- 6. **Light it up** Unless your trailer or caravan has operational tail lights and is clearly visible, you cannot drive it at night or when visibility is poor.

Penalty: \$121 fine plus \$60 Victims of Crime Levy and one demerit point.

7. **Stick it out** – Limits apply to how far items can protrude from the back or sides of your trailer or caravan. A load cannot stick out more than 15cm from the sides and cannot exceed a total width of 2.5m. The total length of your vehicle and attachment cannot be more than 19m and if any item sticks out more than 1.2m from the back of the trailer, you must have a flag attached during the day, or a red light that is visible for 200m at night.

Penalty: #170 fine plus \$60 Victims of Crime Levy.

8. **Following Distance** – If the total combined length of your car and any attached trailer or caravan is 7.5m or more, you must leave at least 60m between you and another long vehicle in front. If you are in a signed road trail area, the minimum distance is 200m.

Penalty: \$212 fine plus \$60 Victims of Crime Levy and one demerit point.

Preparation time: 20 minutes

Total cooking time: 2 hours 10 minutes

Makes: 1 cake

2 cups raisins chopped

2 cups sultanas

1 cup currants

2/3rds of a cup of blanched almonds, chopped

½ cup red glace cherries

1 cup soft brown sugar

125g unsalted butter, chopped

¼ cup brandy

2 eggs lightly beaten


¾ cup plain flour

34 cup self raising flour

2 teaspoons mixed spice




- 1. Put the dried fruits, almonds, glace cherries, sugar, butter, brandy and 1 cup water into a large saucepan. Bring to the boil, stirring occasionally until the sugar has dissolved and the butter has melted. Remove from the heat and set aside to cool to room temperature.
- 2. Preheat the oven to warm 160C (315F.) Grease and line a 20 cm (8 inch) round cake tin or 18cm (7 inch) square cake tin.
- 3. Add the eggs to the fruit, then sift in the flours and spice. Mix together, working quickly and lightly, but don't overmix. Spoon into the prepared tin, tap the tin on the bench to remove any air bubbles, then smooth the surface with a wet hand or fingers. Wrap



4. Cool completely in the tin, covered with a clean tea towel, then turn out. Store in an airtight container or wrap in plastic for 2-3 months.

It's a quick, easy recipe to make and the cake keeps well too. I hope you enjoy it as much as we do!



Double chocolate rum balls







Ingredients

- 250 g of chocolate cake
- 200 g of dark good quality cooking chocolate
- 1/4 cup of cream
- 30 g of butter
- 1 cup of desiccated coconut
- 1 teaspoon of rum (and 1 teaspoon of Bailey's optional)

Method

- Combine the butter and cream in a small saucepan under low heat until it just starts to boil.
- 2. Take the saucepan off the heat and add chocolate and stir until chocolate has melted.
- 3. Crumb the chocolate cake in a food processor.
- Add cake crumbs, half a cup of the desiccated coconut and rum (and Bailey's) until mixed evenly.
- 5. Refrigerate for about 30 min until firm enough to handle.
- 6. Roll into small balls and roll ecah ball in the remaining desiccated coconut.
- 7. Refrigerate for another 30 min before serving.

White Christmas Made With White Chocolate

Ingredients

- 500g White Chocolate Buttons
- 1½ cup Rice Bubbles
- · 120g Red Glace Cherries, cut in half
- 1 cup Roasted Almonds, cut in half
- · 2 cups Desciccated Coconut
- 1 Teaspoon Vanilla Extrract

Method

- 1. Melt White Chocolate carefully over a double boiler.
- 2. Remove from heat and fold in the rest of the ingredients
- 3. Line a tray, approximately 38cm X 24cms with Baking Paper
- 4. Using the back of a large metal spoon, press mixture into the tray
- 5. Refrigerate overnight to set
- 6. To serve, carefully turn White Christmas on to a cutting board
- Using a knife that has been dipped in hot water, cut into small squares or diamond shapes.
