



#### **IDEAS AND INFORMATION**

### FEES TO SUPPORT MAINTENANCE OF NGARKAT CONSERVATION PARK

People can camp out under the stars at Ngarkat Conservation Park at nine different camp sites and enjoy stretching their legs on the eight diverse walking trails.

The newly refurbished Pertendi Hut interpretive trail is one of the eight trails in which visitors can learn about how fire has shaped the park's landscape.

Entrance fee \$10 applies for the current year or visitors can buy the following:

- \$60 Single Parks Pass which covers them for 12 months entrance only
- \$120 Single Parks Pass with camping
- \$90 Multi Parks Pass
- \$180 Multi Parks Pass with camping

Activities at the park supported by the fees include:

- Supporting volunteers who work in the parks; Annual 4WD Association Border track working bee
- Feral animal control programs (Ngarkat wild dog baiting program)
- Fire management actions (such as the annual rolling program for fire breaks and the prescribed burning to help limit large scale fires)
- Programs to help protect threatened and endangered species such as Mallee fowl and the Mallee emu wren
- Infrastructure maintenance.

### NEW ACCESS ARRANGEMENTS - WOOMERA PROHIBITED AREA (WPA)

Amendments to the Defence Act have established a co-existence framework to provide greater certainty of access and assurance to all non-Defence users around Defence activity in the WPA. The Act also introduces, through the *Woomera Prohibited Area Rule 2014*, a permit system for non-Defence user access; access management zones with defined exclusion periods; and new compliance and enforcement measures. The Rule came into effect on 27 August 2014.

#### **Implications for Tourists**

Tourists will need to apply for a **Tourist Permit** to transit through or travel to all areas within the WPA other than the:

- Stuart Highway;
- William Creek Road;
- The Lake, Cadibarrawirracanna Road;
- Olympic Dam Pimba Road: and
- The Woomera Village.

Permits previously issued by the Woomera Test Range for travel up until end October 2014 remain valid. ### Jellyfish and Vinegar

AVRU (<u>Australian Venom Research Institute</u>) at the University of Melbourne pioneered the Pressure Immobilisation Bandage as first aid for snakebite, which has now been adopted worldwide, and recommend the following as the best first aid for jellyfish stings:

#### Vinegar

Use for **Box Jellyfish and Irukandji**.

- **Step 1**: Pour plenty of vinegar over the wound (for at least 30 seconds).
- Step 2: Remove any tentacle material still stuck to the patient's skin.
- **Step 3**: Seek medical help as soon as possible.

**Why?** – To prevent the further release of venom into the skin.

### **Hot water**

Use for non-tropical Bluebottles, Crown-of-Thorns Starfish, Sea Anemones, Sea Urchins and Stinging Fish including Stingrays (but note the special instructions for Stingray wounds).

- **Step 1**: Remove any spines or tentacles with tweezers. Note: Do not remove barbs from stingray wounds, as this must be done in hospital only.
- **Step 2**: Bathe the wound with hot water (that is no hotter than 45 degrees Celsius) to relieve pain. The other unaffected limb should be comfortable in the water test it on yourself first to avoid causing a burn.
- **Step 3**: Seek medical help as soon as possible.

Why? – To relieve pain.

In regard to Box Jellyfish *Chironex fleckeri* and others of this ilk...

I would still rely on the advice in Sutherland & Tibballs (2nd Edition 2001) "Australian Animal Toxins" Oxford Uni Press. Pg 581 "Of all the substances tested by Hartwick et al., only vinegar or acetic acid solutions up to a concentration of 10% produced rapid and complete inhibition ..."and (same page) "... Light (1914) recorded that the natives of the Philippines recommended ...a mixture of vinegar and sugar ..." Pg 587 "... mildly painful stings respond well to ... ice-and-water packs after the application of vinegar.

Treatment for envenomation by venomous fish other than stone fish including the well-loved "Happy Moments" *Siganus spinus* is immersion in warm to hot water ... Ibid Pg 660 "...hot water also increases the blood flow through the envenomed area, thus dispersing the venom." Confused? I'm not! After 25 years in the NT 23 of them in the Top End I would carry copious amounts of vinegar and wear a stinger suit. Dieter

For box jellyfish. Flood the entire stung area with vinegar for at least 30 seconds.

Bluebottle or Pacific man of war jellyfish and sea anemone. Apply cold packs or ice to reduce pain.

#### HISTORY CORNER

The following article, which makes very interesting reading, was printed in Westprint Friday Five dated 19 September 2014. (In July 2010 a trip report was written in the Gawler 4WD Newsletter about a visit made to Sir Hubert Wilkins' house. Sir Hubert is related to Brenton Wilkin one of our club member.)



Great World Firsts – Sir Hubert Wilkins

In Westprint Friday Five – Aug 29, 2014 there was a piece titled "Great World Firsts – The Things we Made, The Things We Did'. The article said that Australians "were the first in the world to explore both the Arctic and Antarctica by air".

That could only be a reference to Sir Hubert Wilkins Kt. MC and Bar. Hubert Wilkins is an unsung and unknown Australian hero. Most Australians would not recognize his name.

Hubert George Wilkins was born near Hallett South Australia in 1888. He was the last of 13 children. As a teenager he moved to Adelaide where he found work with a travelling cinema. He then went to England where he became a pioneering aerial photographer. In 1912 he was sent to Turkey to shoot movies of the Balkan War for the Gaumont Company. He became the first to take moving pictures of a battlefield from the air.

In 1913-16 he was cinematographer to the Canadian Arctic Expedition, becoming second in command. In 1917 he returned to Australia and enlisted. He became an official war photographer with the Australian War Records Office on the Western Front under CW Bean. He carried the rank of Captain. Wounded 15 times, he was twice awarded the Military Cross. Always unarmed, he is the only Australian official photographer to be awarded a combat decoration. In 1919, at the end of the war, he travelled to Gallipoli with Bean's official party to make a photographic record of the battlefield.

Returning to England, Wilkins learnt of the England to Australia air race. Sponsored by the London *Daily Mail* Wilkins was appointed commander and navigator of the Blackburn biplane entry. The plane crashed in Crete where he was informed that Ross and Keith

Smith had arrived in Australia and won the prize.

In 1919-1920 he was second in command of the British Imperial Antarctic Expedition. This was the first time in Antarctica for Wilkins. The expedition was poorly funded and achieved little. In 1921-1922 he was chief of the scientific staff and naturalist of the Shackleton-Rowett Antarctic Expedition. Shackleton dies on the expedition.

In 1923-1925 he was leader of the British Museum of Natural History expedition to Northern Australia to collect and photo specimens native to tropical and outback Australia. Wilkins is highly commended for his work quality.

In 1926-1928 he was leader of the Wilkins-Detroit Arctic Expedition during which Wilkins developed the first ski-landing gear for aircraft.

In 1928 together with pilot Ben Eielson he made the first Trans-Arctic airplane flight from America to Europe. The flight extended 2,200 miles, took 20 hours across 10 time zones. For the flight Wilkins was honoured by 15 international learned societies with gold medals and awards. He was knighted by King George V.

Both Wilkins and Eielson became international celebrities in the northern hemisphere. ("He accomplished a feat in navigation which can be confidently declared unparalled in the history of flying". Quotation made by the American Geographical Society's chief surveyor after the flight when he was scrutinizing the flight log book).

In 1928 Wilkins sold one of his Fokker aircraft used in the Arctic to Charles Kingsford Smith in San Francisco. Renamed the *Southern Cross* it flew into history as the first plane to cross the Pacific from America to Australia. That plane now lies in its own museum at Brisbane Airport, the Wilkins connection hardly known.

In 1928 Wilkins & Eielson made the first aerial reconnaissance flight over Antarctica flying 600 miles in the Lockheed Vega used in the Trans Arctic flight. The following year Wilkins was a passenger in the *Graf Zeppelin* during its round the world trip. Working for Randolph William Hearst he became the first Australian to fly around the world. In 1929 he found time between adventures to marry Australian actress Suzanne Bennett in the USA.

In 1931 Wilkins commanded the *Nautilus* submarine expedition to the Arctic. Whilst he failed to achieve his main aim of taking the vessel under the polar ice to the North Pole, due to mechanical failure of the former USN WW1 submarine, he did sail under the Arctic ice and proved it could be achieved.

Between 1936 and 1939 Wilkins was second in command of 3 privately sponsored expeditions to Antarctica in the *Wyatt Earp*. In 1940-1945 Wilkins was retained by the US Military and taught polar survival skills and advised the US Army on hot and cold weather clothing. From 1945-1958 Wilkins continued to advise the US Military. Wilkins also continued to advise the US Navy on ice travel below the ice with its early nuclear submarines.

In 1958 Wilkins died in Massachusetts USA of a heart attack. The British Government offered to inter Wilkins in Westminster Abbey. The offer was rejected by Lady Wilkins. In 1959 the USS *Skate* made history by surfacing at the North Pole in winter.

As a mark of respect the US Navy had the ashes of Sir Hubert on board. A memorial service was held on the ice and his ashes were committed to the Arctic ice. Lady Wilkins died in the USA in 1974. In 1975 the US Navy carried Lady Wilkins ashes to the North Pole

on a nuclear submarine where they were released to join those of her husband.

Right through his adventurous life Wilkins always retained his Australian citizenship and passport. On North Terrace Adelaide there is a dedicated plaque amongst the 'South Australian Greats'. Wilkins was a keen writer and wrote at least 4 books.

In 2001 Dick Smith opened the rebuilt Wilkins family stone home at Mt Bryan East near Hallett SA. The rebuilding was funded by *Australian Geographic*. In 2008 the Wilkins ice runway was opened at the Australian Antarctic Research Station Casey

Wilkins was a self-educated boy who went on to do almost unbelievable things with 'plenty of nothin'. Wilkins was publicity shy, always uneasy in dealing with the media. Wilkins never cared whether he was the first man to fly to the South Pole or to take a submarine under the ice. He left others to claim the glory. And importantly he survived. Not for him R F Scott's heroic but misguided attempts at fame and achievement. He lived to tell of his 'boy's own tale'.

Should Australians be looking for heroes Wilkins with his laconic, modest and resourceful qualities might be our man. Phillip Clarkson. Sydney. September 2014







#### **CLUB TRAINING**

### Please give the following your consideration before the October meeting!

One of the roles of your club is to facilitate 4WD training of members. This is done in-conjunction with the Four Wheel Drive SA Driver Training Unit (DTU). As many will know, until recently the DTU was a Registered Training Organisation (RTO). A little lesser known fact was that the DTU was one of the largest RTOs, in terms of number of registered trainers and assessors. The DTU RTO scope included the training of assessors to the recognised Workplace Training and Assessment TAE40110.

As an RTO, the DTU was subject to regular audit. Last year, responsibility for RTO management moved from the State Government to the Federal Government resulting in a change of rules and additional audit requirements. The DTU estimated that the cost of meeting the new audit requirements would exceed \$10,000 and the decision was made for the DTU to forgo its RTO status.

To continue to provide a recognised level of training to the member clubs, the DTU has entered into an agreement with an existing RTO, 4WD Training Queensland. Unfortunately, the scope of registration of 4WD Training Qld does not cover the training and certification of <u>assessors</u>.

With the recent departure of Dave and Karen Hall, it has left our club without a certified <u>assessor</u>. As your club's Training Officer, I have every intent of gaining the required TAE qualification in the near future; but this is being done privately and at commercial training rates. This leads to a recent discussion by your committee:

**Should we have our own club assessor?** The committee would like the Club's ideas as to how we might go about it. The committee would like to know how many members are really interested in continuing their training. **Do we really need an assessor?** We are looking at options at the moment. Please think about these questions and present your ideas along with any potential answers. The club has recently been given a \$400 donation to consider its use into getting our own <u>assessor</u>. It costs around \$1500 to qualify a <u>trainer</u> to be an <u>assessor</u>.

We will bring this to the floor for discussion at the October General Meeting. If you want or need more information please contact myself (Peter) or one of the committee.


### To the Gawler 4WD Club
