

Holowiliena Station



Holowiliena Station is the only one of South Australia's pastoral leases still held in the names of the original lessees. Fourth, fifth and sixth generations of the family currently live and work on the station, managing the agricultural enterprise in partnership with an emerging tourism business: bringing the past, into our future. Here's our story.

William and Jennett Warwick, originally from Dumfrieshire in Scotland, arrived in South Australia in 1839 with their three oldest children. They found farm work in the Gawler area before their employers, the Doctors Browne, offered William the management of Canowie Station in the midnorth.

William soon went looking for his some land of his own. Initially travelling north to Arkaba, he found a suitable block south-east of Warcowie for which he obtained the required 'Annual Occupational Licence'. Jennett, the girls and younger children then stayed at Arkaba while William and the older boys built a hut at the place now known as Yak, part of Holowiliena. When the family arrived in 1852, living with 10 children in a tiny hut, it surely must have felt remote! It was three years later that they moved to the current homestead site and established the beautiful buildings, working with local materials: stone, timber and lime.

One of the special things about Holowiliena is the family and station history that has been retained in the belongings left by previous generations at the station. The station office houses diaries dating back to 1864, and many books much older. The station store has, over the years, accumulated a selection of homestead and farming equipment that would have been used by the Warwick family.

Richard and Janne Warwick have been managing Holowiliena since 1981. Their daughter, Frances, returned to Holowiliena with her husband, Luke Frahn, in 2008, and now have two young children. Holowiliena remains true to its origins - it is a property built on good, strong merino sheep and their wonderful soft wool. Luke, a shearer, and Frances, a wool classer, plan to continue this business with Richard and Janne into the future.

In the early days, the Warwick family established a station of good repute, and the Holowiliena diaries note visits from people from all walks of life: swaggies, surveyors, stockmen and settlers. Our family today prides itself on the warm welcome we give friends and visitors, just as it was in the olden days. Where callers may have needed essential supplies many years ago, today we offer cups of tea or wood-fired pizzas, and a chance to hear about life at Holowiliena, both today and in the past.

The proposed Easter trip for 2016 includes a visit to Holowiliena Station and the above gives a broad outline of how the station came into being. More information is available on their website www.holowilienastation.com.

From here it was into Hidden Valley, where we stopped for lunch, enjoying the shade of the trees or the hut if preferred, with a long drop a short walk away.

then it was on to Magnetic Hill, where several did the impossible and travelled backwards up the hill towards Magnetic Hill. John had to do it twice, just to make sure! From here more good dirt roads back into Peterborough where the Gawler mob stopped for the mandatory ice cream at the local servo.
