Basic Driving and Recovery theory training course

This course is made up of:

- o Theory training weekend on 13-14 August
- o Followed by a practical driving weekend at Ashbourne on 20-21 August

Practical Driving - mud and water at Ashbourne (near Strathalbyn) on 20-21 August

You may also nominate for this practical driving event at Ashbourne without doing the theory weekend.

Trip planning and leading at Cavan on Sunday 16 October

Practical Driving - sand at Peake on 5-6 November

Oziexplorer/GPS - Cavan 12 or 13 November

Note this is a one day course with choice of either date; the day will be selected to suit the majority of attendees.

Course costs

The course costs are very good value for what you receive. For the practical driving events you receive one on one training and assessment in your vehicle by a DTU Training person.

The DTU reimburses their Training Officers for their fuel costs so this is part of the cost you pay and the other is the property access fee paid to the landowner as most of our training venues are private property.

TRIP REPORTS

MYSTERY HISTORY DAY TRIP

NATIONAL MILITARY VEHICLE MUSEUM and MALLALA MUSEUM SUNDAY 1ST MAY 2016

Seven cars met at the Gawler Visitors Centre for a trip of learning for the day. Quenton our leader for the day (he just keeps coming up with all these wonderful places that we don't know about). Bronte & Norma, Peter & Sandra, Max & Lyn, Keryn, Brenton & Wil, John & Jane, Wayne & Sandra headed off from Gawler Information Centre about 9:40 am following our mighty leader and trusting him to take us somewhere we had never been!!!!!!!!!!!

First stop was at the National Military Vehicle museum Edinburgh Ave Salisbury formally known as Penfield, which at first I thought - male domination for sure, but I must admit I enjoyed and found quite interesting.

The place was used in the 1940's as a munitions factory which had a large number of females working there. It was known as one of the largest explosives factories in Australia. By August 1942 it was making -



- Trinitrotoluene TNT
- Nitro-glycerine
- Ammonium nitrate & several initiators

They made caps & detonators, preparing the small components, primers & fuses. Filling cartridges cases with propellant & fitting them with primers. They fitted shell bodies with high explosives & assembling each to form a complete round of ammunition. Other munitions factories were at Finsbury and Hendon.

The 50's & 60's saw the Blue steel Nuclear Standoff missile being assembled at the factory, the 80's it was used to service rapier missiles for Australia, then for many years stood vacant.



The last 6 years the museum has been in its present place and is struggling to raise the money to buy the property, as the owner wants to sell. This would be such a loss of so much history, not only in things being displayed but in the buildings that remain. A group of volunteers (ex-military and civilians) run the museum, raise funds and rebuild/maintain/seek out new exhibits. They also have a resident pair of Peregrine Falcons that has raised several

young chicks. They are rare in South Australia.

We were split into 2 groups and Jeff and Trevor were guides for the tours, what a wealth of knowledge our guide Jeff was. As we walked in there was a massive tank known as Miss Stuart with a picture of a lady painted on it which took 10 years to put together as it was just a shell in a paddock; they have collected parts from all over the world for the tank. Some of the names on the vehicles are that of members that have died and have been a great help to the volunteer group. We saw machine guns from Canada & England all used in wars,



Howitzer & anti tank guns. 2 Malvern Star bikes that take 2 bolts to put the bike together or take apart that were used in war zone. Clearly I am not war minded as I would want something faster than a push bike in a war!!!!!!

They had different displays of different things -

- WW1 with horses Mr Ed and Trigger. A horse drawn ammunition limber for an 18 pounder field gun, not only did the horse have to cart the ammo but also the personal and bedding poor things.
- Uniforms from most wars even present day which was great to see.
- Military models of tanks, jeeps, planes etc, art work, posters and lots of interesting bits and pieces.
- Many different vehicles that have been restored, to name a few -1039 Armoured car Bandicoot, Land Rovers, $\frac{1}{4}$ ton 4x4 Willys MB Jeep, Maron Herrington all wheel drive and kitchen set up for out in the fields.
- A large display of communication equipment from WW1 to Vietnam, (which didn't seem much lighter to carry). We got to try our hand at Morse code which we were told that women were better at then men!!!!!

Next on the agenda was a ride in a vehicle around the compound and morning tea with lots of goodies.

Lunch was a relaxing time at Clonlea Park

Next port of call Mallala Museum which has been done up since we were last out there. How fantastic this place is, really clean and well looked after.

They had many displays -

- Mallala Institute theatre, old projectors, seats and a well preserved back drop from the institute
- A large display for the soldiers that went to war, large photos of the ones that died but a lot of information of the ones that returned also.
- Found a much younger photo of Quenton Earl in the display of families of the area.
