Perhaps what you might not know is that from January 2017, camping in **all** national / conservation parks within South Australia must be pre-booked on-line. (As part of the recent Cox's Mill campsite construction project in Ngarkat CP, we had to number each site in preparation for the booking change!)





After a leisurely lunch, we headed up Gawler Park Road to Gully Gardens dried fruits and nuts. Since Angas Park has closed its factory/shop in Angaston, Gully Gardens has become even busier. They are not normally open on Sundays, but opened up for us. They have a large range of dried fruits and nuts, gift packs, and you can even have a coffee here. They have built a function room and with the addition of new toilets, are catering for tourists and small bus groups on the food and wine trail of the Barossa. Their son gave us a demonstration of whip cracking, and he hopes to compete in the 2017 Royal Adelaide Show. We also checked out the farm animals including lambs, a very friendly sheep, goats, chooks and birds, all in beautifully kept grounds.

On the road again, and we are now heading for Pindarie Winery for our 2.00pm booked wine tasting session. Today Michael was our host and we sampled a selection



of whites and reds that their they grow on "western ridge" property. Cheese and were also Crackers served in the carefully restored old stables they now use as the tasting room. After our selections of wines were purchased we gathered on the verandah of the old grain store which they now use as a lunch area. We had a coffee while enjoying a chat

and were visited by the owners small and friendly dog. We laughed as this dog chased a drone being flown in the paddock that the winery cellar door overlooks.

RON KANDELARS – Guest Speaker September 2016.

At the September General meeting, Quenton introduced our Guest Speaker Ron Kandelars

Ron is a well know media identity in South Australia and spoke about his beginnings as a Journalist at the ABC and from there went onto Commercial TV, the most prominent being Channel 9's "Postcards with Keith Conlon." He now does a mixture of roles which include presenting short interest stories on Channel Seven and media training.

After giving us an insight into the techniques journalists use to check if a story will be worthwhile and well received by the public, Ron began talking about some of the stories he presented which included:

Pop Kaeslers Caravan which is on show at Nuriootpa is the caravan built by Pop to take his family touring around Australia.

Farina Bakery which is reopened by a group of volunteers at certain times of the year the aim, of which, is to raise money to help in the preservation of the other buildings in Farina.

Olaf Hansen a Goolwa Chef who has embraced the art of slow cooking pipis (cockles) and can be seen peddling his char grilled BBQ on Goolwa beaches and selling serves of this delicious seafood all with an accompaniment of garlic, lemon, capers, tarragon and herbs.

Ron was an excellent speaker giving us an insight into a career that I certainly did not know much about.

Bird Study

Another Government study provides outstanding results. Government Officials admitted that they found about 200 dead crows on the highway between Noonamah and Palmerston, in Northern Territory, where there was concern that they may have died from Avian Flu. The Territory Government contracted a bird pathologist to examine the remains of all the crows and he confirmed the problem was definitely NOT Avian Flu, much to everyone's relief.

However, he determined that 98% of the crows had been killed by impact with trucks, and only 2% were killed by car impact. (Didn't know there was a difference.)

The Territory Government then hired an Ornithological Behaviourist to determine the disproportionate percentages for truck versus car kills.

After 18 months of research and \$2.7 million spent, the Ornithological Behaviourist determined the cause in the deaths. When crows eat road kill, they always set-up a look-out crow in a nearby tree to warn of impending danger.

His conclusion was that the lookout crow could say Cah, but he couldn't say Truck.
