DTU INFORMATION

Last month, I summarised the Basic and Intermediate level courses being offered by the DTU. The other two driving competency based courses being offered are:

- a. Advanced 4WD driving, and
- b. Advanced 4WD Recovery

The "boxes" below outline the requirements for each course.

Advanced 4WD driving

Competencies:

- 1. Reassessment of competencies covered previously, but in hard to difficult terrain with significant obstacles
- 2. Drive on a winding bush track with rough surface steep sections and narrow twisting sections with blind corners
- 3. Perform emergency tyre repairs

Note: Not suited to vehicles with highway terrain tyres.

Advanced 4WD Recovery

Competencies:

- 1. Recover a vehicle using a snatch strap
- 2. Recover a vehicle using a winch (includes using different type of anchor points, use of a snatch block and repositioning of anchor point during recovery operation
- 3. Recover a vehicle using an exhaust jack
- 4. Recover a vehicle using a Hi Lift jack

The following is an excerpt from Westprint Friday Five dated 31 March 2017. If you wish to have your say about this closure, there is a link at the end of the article which you can use.

From Last Week - closure of shortwave radio service

I observed Andrew's concern in the 17th March issue of Friday Five about the closure of the ABC shortwave radio services in the Northern Territory which occurred on 31st January. In addition to the inland service the international service of the ABC short wave service was also closed. As far as the ABC is concerned it is a done deal and they are not really interested.

However, there has been quite a bit of activity to endeavour to get these services reinstated. Many people have contacted various MPs and other influential people to have this decision reversed. It is up to people like readers of Friday Five to put pen to paper or via email to MPs, etc. expressing their concern and telling them why it is a bad idea. If you read the third submission in the link below you will find it a bit lengthy but sums up the situation.

There has been a senate committee set up to look at the possible restoration of Radio Australia's short wave international broadcasts and the short wave domestic broadcasts in the Northern Territory. By going to the site listed below you will have an opportunity to put ideas forward as to why the services should be retained. You will need to do it promptly as the findings of the deliberation will be finalised in May. I hope you will make the time to submit your opinions to the inquiry. Just because someone else appears to have said it all, this should not stop you from having your say even if it is to say that you agree with what someone else has said. Rodney.



HISTORY OF THE BLINMAN MINE

As you may remember, we had a very interesting speaker in Geoff Randall at the March meeting talking about the Blinman Mine - a mine (and area) that he has a particular interest in. The following is an article prepared by Deb Earl for the magazine which I hope you will find interesting - thank you Deb.

History of Blinman Copper Mine- Guest Speaker Geoff Randall

At our March meeting we were fortunate to have Geoffrey Randall speak at the club meeting on the History of the Blinman Copper mine 1859-1916.

The book Geoff wrote on the Blinman Copper Mine was part of his work as an Honors student at Adelaide University and he has a Bachelor Degree in Environmental Studies, History and Social Sciences which is quite an achievement. The story below is taken in part from his talk and the rest from his book and is only a select history of the mine. Geoff's book is still available to buy so if you are interested please contact the committee for details.

In 1859 the area east of the area now known as the Blinman copper mine was used for sheep grazing and it was a one legged shepherd named Robert Blinman who noticed the green stained rock on a nearby hill. From this discovery he set about filing for a mineral claim of

the area at a cost of 5 pounds and convinced three others to join him in this venture. This syndicate of Robert Blinman, Alfred Frost, Joe Mole and Henry Alford worked a small section of the claim which they sold to the Yudanamutana Copper Mining Company for 6000 pounds. Robert Blinman or "Peg leg Bob" used his profit to begin a wood carting business and later became an hotel licensee in the Flinders Ranges and he is buried at the Quorn Cemetery.

The mine was officially opened on 5 September 1862 with Captain Thomas Anthony as the manager, a Cornish Mine Captain who brought experienced Cornish miners with him from Kapunda, Burra and Moonta.

Water or lack of it was an issue for the Blinman mine and water was eventually sourced from a bore 8 kms south of the town and piped to the mine where it was stored in tanks and dams. This water source was also used for the town. However, the costs involved with transport, infrastructure and wages meant that although the mine was most productive between 1862 and 1880, it was not a profitable venture for the company and the Yudanamutana company changed its name in 1872 to the Blinman Consolidated Copper Mining Company and in 1880 employed a new manager, Captain W J Paul. However, by 1881 Blinman mine was in need of further capital investment and was taken over by the Corporation of South Australian Copper Mines Limited.

The mine's Managing Director, Mr T.A. Massey, modernised the mine and boilers were brought from the recently defunct Prince Alfred Mine near Belton (NE of Carrieton) via the newly laid northern railway to Parachilna and then by road haulage to Blinman. The official re-opening of the mine in May 1882 was celebrated with an official dinner and the announcement that Captain William Bryant was to supersede Captain Paul as mine manager.
