

## GENERAL INFORMATION:

### On-line bookings for South Australian Parks

From 1 June, entry and camping for Ikara-Flinders Ranges National Park, Vulkathunha-Gammon Ranges National Park, Innamincka Regional Reserve, Malkumba-Coongie Lakes National Park, Witjira National Park and Kati Thanda-Lake Eyre National Park will need to be booked through a booking system. Grindell's Hut, Nudlamutana Hut and the Balcanoonna Shearers Quarters in Vulkathunha-Gammon Ranges National Park will also be available to be booked online before you go. The system has been rolled out across South Australia, and many other states and countries have online booking system for their parks.

The new booking system recognises that there is often high demand for some camping areas during peak periods, and will allow visitors to book their favourite campsites 12 months in advance of a planned visit. For many people it will be a more convenient experience; they can plan and book ahead from the comfort of their home, and they won't have to carry the correct amount of cash.

Over time, self-registration stations (a.k.a. iron rangers) have continually been subjected to acts of vandalism and theft. With the online booking system self-registration stations will no longer be required and cash payments will no longer be accepted.

The Desert Parks Pass that covers entry and camping to the Simpson Desert Regional Reserve and Simpson Desert Conservation Park will still be purchased via normal arrangements. After purchasing your Desert Parks Pass, you will be required to go on-line to book campsites in other parks that are covered by the Desert Parks Pass such as Witjira National Park, Innamincka Regional Reserve, Malkumba-Coongie Lakes National Park and Kati Thanda-Lake Eyre National Park. When booking a campsite, the booking system will ask if you have a Desert Parks Pass, so you will not have to pay twice.

Park visitors need to visit [www.parks.sa.gov.au](http://www.parks.sa.gov.au) to make their bookings. Preferably visitors will book before they leave home, however some visitors prefer not to plan ahead. As mobile reception is limited or non-existent in the Region, or if visitors do not have access to the Internet while travelling, a number of businesses in strategic, remote locations have become agents. They will have signage that on-line payment is available before visitors drive out to the park and can assist you. These agents can be found at [www.parks.sa.gov.au](http://www.parks.sa.gov.au)

It is acknowledged that in the first year, there will be confusion for some visitors but as other States have had similar systems already in place and as word gets around, this will reduce in time.

#### ***Important note from Jo.***

## TRAVEL PROCEDURES


- Please be on time at meeting points **we will not wait.**
- All road rules apply on & off road.
- All vehicles must be roadworthy & covered by insurance.
- (Comprehensive recommended; minimum third party property.)
- All vehicles must have a UHF radio. Club channel is 16. (Alt 17)
- It is recommended that all vehicles carry the following;
  - first aid kit,
  - fire extinguisher, snatch strap, at least one rated bow shackle, small shovel & (sand flag if going in sand hill country), appropriate jacking plate & jack.
- • Ensure you have a full tank of fuel before meeting point.

## TRAVEL PROCEDURE

- Trip leader has **complete authority** during the whole trip.
- **You are responsible for the vehicle behind you.** Wait at obscured turns & intersections. (This is called "Marking the corner for your Buddy")
- If you are not sure which way the vehicle in front of you has gone, stop, call on the radio, or *wait* until they return.
- If you wish to leave the group for any reason please inform the trip leader before you leave the convoy.
- Try to remain in allotted positions within the group, or change with the permission of the person in front or behind you.
- Tail-end Charlie/Assistant Trip Leader is to remain the same.
- When stopping at points of interest, or seeking outside information, **do not** block roadways or impede other traffic.
- If you are unsure how to tackle a particular section, **ask for assistance** do not try to be a **hero**. We may be a long way from professional help.
- When off road, and in doubt, use four wheel drive. H4 or in steep slow terrain L4. (also saves the track from damage)
- Leave all gates **as found**, if in doubt ask!!
- Radio chat is great; but please keep to minimum, especially if in difficult terrain. (Use a 3 second pause between responses. Always acknowledge)

## CAMP PROCEDURES

- Before lighting fires please consult with trip leader.
  - When using "**Bush toilets**" ensure all is buried deeply incl. paper.\*\*\*
  - Remember – leave only your "**foot prints**"
- 
- \*\*\* Paper can also be disposed of by placing it in a brown paper bag and burning on the fire at the end of an evening after everyone has finished with the fire and gone to bed\*\*\*

### TRAVELLING FROM WITHIN SOUTH AUSTRALIA TO THE RIVERLAND REGION (SA Fruit Fly Exclusion Zone)

Within South Australia, travellers and Riverland residents alike are reminded that it is illegal to carry fresh fruit & vegetables which could be potential fruit fly host, into the Riverland region without the proper documentation or certification.

Mobile quarantine roadblocks operate on country roads in South Australia. Motorists travelling to the Riverland from within South Australia may be stopped at a random quarantine roadblock and vehicles checked for fruit & vegetables.

Prominent road signs give warning to travellers approaching this Zone. Roadside bins or pits are available and are clearly signposted for disposal of prohibited produce.

#### ***What conditions apply when carrying fruit/vegetables into the Riverland?***

Fresh unprocessed fruit & fruiting vegetables **purchased from commercial retailers within South Australia** will be permitted into the Riverland *if accompanied by:*

- **An itemised receipt of purchase** or
- **A Plant Health Certificate**

*Note: Cooked, processed, preserved, stewed, dried, frozen or canned fruit and fruiting vegetables are permitted without restriction.*

#### ***What is not permitted into the Riverland?***

The following produce is **not permitted** into the Riverland, and will be confiscated at a random quarantine roadblock:

- Home-grown fresh unprocessed (raw) fruit & fruiting vegetables
- Purchased fresh unprocessed (raw) fruit & fruiting vegetables **without** the proper accompanying receipt of purchase, or Plant Health Certificate

#### ***What is potential fruit fly host produce?***

The female fruit fly lays eggs in *all cultivated fruits and some vegetables* such as:

- **Citrus** – orange, mandarin, lime, grapefruit, lemon, cumquat
- **Pome** – apple, pear, quince, crab-apple
- **Stone** – peach, plum, apricot, nectarine, cherry
- **Tropical and temperate** – avocado, banana, berry fruit, feijoa, fig, guava, grape, passionfruit, loquat, mango, pawpaw, persimmon, olive
- **Fruiting vegetables** - capsicum, chilli, eggplant, tomato, tamarillo

#### ***The message for travellers and Riverland residents is simple –***

- Don't carry fresh, unprocessed fruit & fruiting vegetables into the Riverland Region *unless* accompanied by an itemised receipt of purchase or a Plant Health Certificate
- Take notice of the prominent road signs and eat or dispose of prohibited produce before entering the zone if the entry requirements cannot be met





### HOT CHOCOLATE

1 tbs Nutella

4 cups (1L) milk

1 cup thickened cream

200g dark chocolate, coarsely chopped

12 white marshmallows
