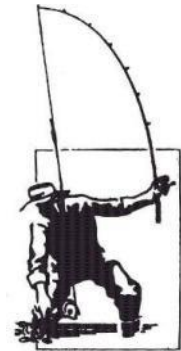

GENERAL INFORMATION

VKS RADIO NETWORK

25 years ago, on the 30th November 1993 the first VKS-737 Radio Network Licence was issued by the Spectrum Management Agency which was the forerunner of the present Australian Communication and Media Authority.

The licence which was in the name of the SA Association of Four-Wheel Drive Clubs was for a single base station located at Hilton with a single frequency of 5455kHz. In those days the licence only covered the base station we then had to obtain individual licences for each of our subscribers at \$48 per subscriber per frequency fitted in the radio, in our first year we had one hundred and eleven licences at a cost of \$5328.

Luckily licencing conditions changed in 1995 to a system where there is now a charge for each frequency at each base station with no limit to how many Subscriber Licence Authorities are issued. Had the previous method of charging still been in place our yearly licence fees payable to ACMA would be in excess of one million dollars (in 1993 values).

In October 1996 the Australian National 4WD Radio Network was incorporated and the VKS-737 licences were transferred to the new organisation.

In December 1996 the Australian Taxation Office issued approval for the Network to become "a Public Benevolent Institution established for the relief of sickness, suffering, helplessness, destitution and misfortune to a disadvantaged section of the community, being all 'outback' travellers who are in distress by providing them with emergency assistance and support in co-operation with other organisations".

In July an agreement was signed with SA Police to provide a joint safety network for subscribers, SA Police patrol cars and police stations fitted with VKS-737 frequencies. Similar arrangements are now in place with emergency services in several other states.

In October 2010 the VKS-737 Radio Network formed a partnership with the Royal Flying Doctor Service of Australia (Queensland Section and Western Operations) to provide Emergency HF radio communications services for the RFDS. As part of the agreement the VKS-737 Radio Network installed new base stations at the RFDS bases in Queensland and Western Australia, these bases operate on all VKS-737 frequencies as well as the existing frequencies licensed to the RFDS at the relevant base.

Since 1993 the Network has grown to seven frequencies at all of our nineteen base stations providing Emergency and General HF communications services for travellers in remote, rural and outback areas of Australia as well as also providing HF Radio-Telephone Services.

TRIP REPORT

Old Government House

Old Government House is located in the Belair National Park approx 11 km south of the city. It was built in 1860 as the summer residence for the State's Governor and was used by Governors MacDonnell (1855-1862) and Daly (1862-1868).

The building was built from locally quarried stone with red brick quoins sourced from the Blackwood brick works with a native timber shingle roof obtained from nearby trees growing on a Government Farm. The building consists mainly of a large dining room with large bay window and turret, a study, a bedroom and adjoining dressing room, a bathroom with a plunge-pool (reportedly the first in the State), and a pantry with large underground cellar. A spacious tiled terrace surrounds the building. The cost was 1600 pounds which was considered a lot of money at the time. Fierce debate followed in parliament, but it seems the final receipts were "lost" by the government of the time.



Behind Old Government House sits a stone cottage built in 1848 and this was now to be used for servants' quarters and the large kitchen. Originally built as two rooms and a lean-to, it was changed to a kitchen and two bedrooms. The kitchen is equipped with a large wood-fired range and two "coppers". All the food had to be carried to the dining room of Old Government House next door.

Many hunting parties were carried out by friends of the Governors in the surrounding bushland.

As the Colony's economy flourished, Marble Hill was built in 1878-79 and replaced Old Government House as the vice-regal summer residence. During the Black Sunday bushfires of 1955 Marble Hill was gutted and it was bought by a private couple in 2007 and is now in the process of being restored.

Over time the shingled roof was replaced with galvanized iron. In 1961 a partial restoration of Old Government House took place and was opened to the public. Between 1975-1982 a major structural restoration took place on both the servants' quarters and Old Government House. The garden was completely redesigned. In 2001 as part of the Federation Centenary the interior was re-interpreted and is what we see today.

The interior is set out as a mid-Victorian vice-regal residence. Many families, some with connections to previous Governors, have donated furniture of the era and the house now reflects how the wealthy of the Victorian era lived. The nearly one acre gardens have also been set out in mid-Victorian style with plants. The SA Rose Society gave a grant to the Friends of Old Government House (who now run the house with help from the Department of Environment and Water) and the new garden layout was opened in October 2018.



Friends of Old Government House conduct tours and show the different styles and furnishings in each building on the first and third Sundays of the month for a gold coin (\$2) donation.

Librarian/Property Officer: (Elected)	To maintain Club's Books, Videos, DVD's, Maps, Magazines from other clubs, general info and to retain 1 copy of each of our Club Newsletters for prosperity. Responsible for maintaining and storing all Club Property.
Committee Member/s: (Elected)	To help and undertake responsibilities as decided by the club.
Trip Leader:	Any member of the club can organise and run a Club Trip of their choice providing all aspects of trip and convoy regulations are strictly adhered to. (Refer to Club By-Laws)
Welcoming Officer/s: (Volunteers Appointed)	To make welcome any potential new members which may come to the club meetings as visitors. Answer any of their questions about the club and offer some information about the club.
