

# Landscape South Australia Act 2019

From 1 July 2020, we will enter a new era with transition to the Landscape South Australia Act 2019 (the Act) and the new Murraylands and Riverland Landscape Board will administer the Act in this region. This Act replaces the Natural Resources Management Act 2004 as the framework for managing the state's land, water, pest animals and plants, and biodiversity.

Under the Act, eight new regional landscape boards and Green Adelaide will facilitate the sustainable management of our state's landscapes; represented by community members committed to partnering with the community, Aboriginal peoples and landholders.

We look forward to continuing great relationships with our stakeholders and the transition to the new Act and new Board will result in things looking a little bit different in the future.

# Volunteering with children

There have recently been some changes to the requirements for volunteering with children. As of 1 July 2020 all volunteers volunteering with children will need to have a *Working With Children Check*. A *National Police Certificate* is no longer sufficient.

If you have a DSCI Clearance that is still current/valid then this is ok to use until it expires. After this you will need to obtain the new Working With Children Check.



I towed a caravan on a trip to the South East and it also towed a Morris Ute on a car trailer that I once owned. This was amazing since the tow bar was only bolted to the boot floor!
