Just for something different and I have no idea who the recipe belongs to as no name was attached, but this was included in the April 2005 edition of the Newsletter.

#### GASTRONOMIC DELIGHTS

#### Custard Meringue Pie

Have you ever had an left over sponge cake? Here is a recipe that will solve your problem.

#### Ingredients:

3 level tablespoons custard powder

Half litre of milk

2 egg whites

180 gm caster sugar

1 small can apricots

Sponge cake

#### Method:

Depending on the thickness of the cake, cut the cake in halves horizontally and line the bottom of a flameproof dish.

Open the can of apricots and pour the juice over the cake

Put the fruit in a blender and puree, pour fruit over cake.

Blend the custard powder with two tablespoons of milk. Boil the remaining milk with 90 gm sugar. When boiling pour over the blended custard powder and return to the saucepan. Boil for one minute and allow to cool slightly.

Pour over the fruit and leave for about 5 minutes.

Whisk egg whites until stiff. Fold in 30 gm sugar and whisk again. Fold in further 30 gm sugar and pile on top of the custard sprinkling the top with the remaining sugar.

Bake in a slow oven 150C for 25-30 minutes until meringue topping is crisp and golden brown.

Eat and Enjoy!!

(PS: Not sure if this can be cooked in a camp oven but you'll never know until you try!!)

Bob Tonkin had his cowboy hat on.


Bob Mulyk had lots of interesting badges on his hat.

The Pines Reserve was developed between 1877 - 1882. The Forest Reserve, Taylor's Run Reserve and Kapunda Nursery. By 1988 2/3 of the 35 acres had been planted with Remarkable and Cluster pines along with Sugar Gums that were cut down for telegraph poles by 1902. In May 1931, the then government granted contracts to cut down the trees with only 2 rows remaining. The popular picnic area declined until the now Pines committee have taken up looking after the area.

After morning tea headed into Kapunda to have a look in the art gallery, so many talented people. Then to the information centre to see the exhibition on Sir Sydney Kidman, wow what a interesting life and such a generous man.



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After travelling the countryside and sleeping under the stars for many years and doing a range of jobs from 14 years of age, he married Isabel Brown Wright, they had 6 children 2 whom died while young. He was a bit stunned to think he needed a house to live in with his wife, so they bought Bald Hill house with grand views over Kapunda. This now a private owned home and a work in progress for renovations and the massive yard needs a lot of work. The next home was Eringa house which looks beautiful from the outside. It was gutted by fire then rebuilt. It was donated to the education department for a high school for Kapunda by Sir Sydney Kidman.


There was another exhibition on the people that help found Kapunda and also about Light council. Lots about the mine, Seppeltsfield and did not realise how big an area light council covered until I walked over the map on the floor in the exhibition. They have done such an excellent job with the exhibitions. The information centre incorporates the library as well, Pauline picked up a bargain with a bag of books for \$2.

Lunch was at the bakery Litl Mo's, yum yum......

Some of us stayed for a scenic drive around Kapunda looking at the houses the Kidman's lived in and some beautiful old homes in the town. Went up to the look out and to the Kapunda mine trail. There Keryn did some horse whispering with Clyde the draft horse and Keryn and myself got to have a ride on a windlass (an apparatus used for raising ore or water from a mine, usually turned by horses) while Wayne and Brenton push us around.

Clyde is a beautiful metal horse sculpture made of reclaimed scrape metal parts. Joel Zimmermann is the sculptor from the Barossa.


