HERITAGE SOUTH AUSTRALIA – PHOTOGRAPHY COMPETITION

This one might interest the budding photographers in our Club. I'm sure plenty of heritage type photos have been taken on trips to some of the interesting places we've been to in the State.

Heritage South Australia, in conjunction with the South Australian Heritage Council and Botanic Gardens Restaurant, is running a photography competition to promote South Australia's wonderful State Heritage Places. It is called '[Heritage SnAps Photo Competition 2021](#)'.

By raising awareness of State Heritage Places in South Australia (we now have 2,302 of them!) we will encourage the community to visit the places and take interest in our state's heritage. We want to positively engage with individuals and the communities to inspire interest and participation in taking high quality photographs of State Heritage Places. The competition coincides with the release of our new Heritage Tourism Strategy for South Australia – '[Growing our Heritage Future](#)'.

There are 4 categories for people to enter photos:

Category 1 – Maritime Heritage coastal and riverine (includes Shipwrecks and Heritage listed lighthouses, jetties, obelisks, wharfs and boatsheds).

- Category 2 – State Heritage visits (featuring photos of State Heritage Places you have been to)
- Category 3 – Professional and Edited photos of State Heritage Places
- Category 4 – Young talent (under 18) taking photos of State Heritage Places (encouraging school age kids to learn about our Heritage).

(We are pleased to see photos of people enjoying our State Heritage Places, however, if your photo features people, please ensure you have their consent before entering the photo/s into the competition)

Heritage South Australia encourages all students to enter - either via Category 4 if under 18, or any other category if over 18.

SHARING PHOTOS FOR WEB AND NEWSLETTER

We are often asked how best to share photos for the newsletter and for adding to the Web site. Hopefully, the following will provide a useful guide.

TRIP REPORTS AND TRIP PHOTOS

Trip reports are certainly enhanced with the inclusion of photos and other images and there are a couple of simple steps to make both your job of writing the trip report and the editor's job of adding to the newsletter.

The trip report should be written in plain text using Word or any other text editor. Please try to avoid using special styles and fonts as these are often not compatible with the Newsletter format and have to be discarded. If you do need to include some special text, have a yarn with Publisher Pete or Editor Sandra to make sure we capture your moment appropriately.

Also, please do not include photos in the text of your report. If you want a particular photo in your text, please indicate where the photo should go. For example **Photo 1** here.

Please submit your photos separately.

PHOTO SUBMISSIONS

There are 3 ways to submit photos for trips reports and inclusion on the Web site. In each case, please do not reduce the resolution; the higher the better. Please make sure the photos have a unique name and, if you can include a text name such as "Bill's Bus", rather than a number that would be even better. Of course, it would also be ok to create a list with the photo title and photo number.

OK, now to the submission options.

Option 1, E-Mail. Photos can be emailed to publisher@gawler4wd.com.au or directly to Sandra or Pete. Remember that many systems limit the size of e-mail so you won't be able to send more than one or two at a time.


Option 2, USB Stick. The club has a few USB sticks than can be used to exchange photos and this has worked reasonably well in the past. However, there is a between way...

Option 3, Upload to Internet. For each event, or trip we will create a space in "the cloud" for you to upload your photos to. The link to this space will be emailed to event participants and we'll ask you to upload your photos. To simplify the upload and sorting process, we will create separate folders for each participant. Using the link, you will be able to see the submissions from others and this might help you sort out your best photos.






You will see folders for **"Bills Photos"** and **"Petes Photos"**

To upload your photos select **"Upload files"** (highlighted above).



Follow the prompts to upload your files - actually you can upload any files. See the example I have included under **"Petes Photos"**.

This project, and others are co-ordinated by SA Arid Lands Landscape Board, part of Dept. of Environment and Water.



This trip is advertised in the Toyota Club's newsletter but is actually being run by the Overland Club. If anyone is interested from the Gawler Club they could certainly join in. Details listed below:

This is a request for volunteers to work on Pernatty Station. This is an approved TLCCSA Trip. The request has come via 4WDSA from the Arid Lands Board on behalf of the owners of Pernatty Station.

Pernatty Station is a very large sheep grazing property located just South of Woomera between the Highway and Lake Torrens. This station property is an 'Organic Property' and requires significant work to rid itself of some noxious weeds. Mount Gunson is a part of the property and Oz Minerals have a mine on this property as well.

The work required is;

- (1.) to remove a weed called **Bathurst Burr**. This weed requires physical removal and then to be burnt.
- (2.) Some of the creeks and waterways have cactus which requires killing/culling.
- (3.) Also required is the identification, locating and then GPS plotting of some particular native species for recording and reporting.

This trip is to be managed and lead by the **Overland Club**, but will still be a sanctioned and approved trip of the TLCCSA to those members attending. There is no current identified Trip Leader at this stage.

The current dates set for this trip are 11th – 18th September 2021.

There is no requirement or obligation for volunteers to stay the whole week.

There is a significant Shearer's quarter's available for residing in during your stay, but Campers and Caravans are suitable and permitted.




