PS History info from Brent.

The beautifully designed tramline power poles are cast iron, over 100 years old formerly used in King William Street,



Adelaide. The trams were originally sold privately for about 30 pounds each and mainly used as fishermans' shacks, cubby houses, and one as a fernery. Eventually they were donated back to be restored. The Salisbury Council were heavily involved in the early stages of setting up and donating land for the museum.



RECIPE

I did request some recipes at the last general meeting but there were none forthcoming, so I'll add one of my own. I usually mix together the ingredients, except sultanas that I take separately, and put the mixture into zip lock bags when going on a trip and then add the liquid when I want to make them up.

Ingredients:

2 cups SR Flour

1 tablespoon butter or marge

1 tablespoon sugar (or less depending on taste)

1 teaspoon baking powder

Handful of sultanas (if required)

1 cup milk

Method 1:

Put all dry ingredients & sultanas in a bowl and mix together Melt butter and add to flour mixture together with milk Mix lightly into a soft dough about 2 cm thick Cut out and bake in oven for approx. 15 minutes at 180C or until cooked Makes approx. 10 scones

Method 2:

Mix flour and baking powder together
Rub in butter or marge
Add sultanas and sugar and mix together
Add milk and mix to dough and bake as above.

Butter and eat when still warm or use jam and cream if leaving out sultanas.
