

LEN BEADELL ROADS

Leonard Beadell OAM BEM FIEMS was a surveyor, road builder, bushman, artist and author, responsible for constructing over 6,000 km of roads and opening up isolated desert areas some 2.5 million square kilometres - of central Australia from 1947 to 1963. Born in West Pennant Hills, New South Wales, Beadell is sometimes called "the last true Australian explorer".

WHERE AM I

This sculpture celebrates the life and achievements of Ken Blake, an Australian motorcycling icon.

Blake grew up in Strathalbyn. He started racing a 1964 Triumph in 1966 and went on to conquer the greats in his chosen sport, winning 11 national championships.

The sculpture depicts Blake and a Suzuki RG500. He famously won the 1976 Australian 500 Tourist Trophy on this model motorcycle, defeating 15 time World Champion, Giacomo Agostini in a thrilling race.

Tragically, Ken Blake died in 1981 after crashing his Yamaha TZ350 motorcycle during the Isle of Man Tourist Trophy race.

AUSSIE OUTBACK

Tanami Track by A Stephen Langham and published by Westprint

(This article reminded me of a trip we did about 9 years ago and brought back memories.)

Linking Alice Springs in the Northern territory with Halls Creek in Western Australia, the iconic Tanami Track stretches for around 1050 kilometres, with more than 800 of that being dirt, with the longest distance between fuel stops of around 600 kilometres.

A single strip of bitumen leaves the Stuart Highway and is like this all the way out to Tilmouth Well, a distance of just under 190 kilometres and from there on, the corrugations set in. This is also the only place along the drive that has caravan park facilities and after that, you will be bush camping for a minimum of two nights.

Along the way, old highway camps make a great place to pull in off the track and enjoy the solitude of our Aussie Outback. One place that is a "must" camp location is along the Sturt Creek, not far from the Billiluna Aboriginal Community that also sells fuel.

Depending on which way the wind is blowing, you are better to stop and get off the road when you see one of the many Road Trains coming towards you, as you cannot see through the wall of dust and you would not want to meet another vehicle head on through the dust cloud.

If travelling solo, you must be fully prepared, as there are no facilities along the drive and the only phone service is within a very small radius of the Tanami Gold Mine. For this reason, I strongly urge all Outback Travellers to carry a PLB as a minimum piece of safety equipment, while a satellite phone or HF Radio or a SPOT will give you contact in an emergency with the outside world.

One lot of old ruins along the drive are the Mount Doreen ruins that are around 320 kilometres west of Alice Springs, but if you do not have a detailed map, you will pass them by without even knowing where they are.

As this is all traditional Aboriginal Lands, you may encounter traditional turnoffs and the smoke in the distance fills the sky, making it look like rain clouds. The only detour along the way is the famous Wolfe Creek Crater which is around 170 kilometres south of Halls Creek.

TOWNS OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA

In this series of "Towns of South Australia" I will explain a brief history of the town and how it got its name. This month we look at Angaston.

Angaston

Originally known as "German Pass" Angaston was established in 1842. Colonel William Light established a route through here to the Murray river to bypass the steep Mt Lofty Ranges.

The town was named after George Fife Angas, an English Banker, Merchant and Landholder, who purchased 28,000 acres around Angaston for 1 pound an acre. His son John Howard Angas looked after his father's interest as G F Angas remained in England until 1851.

G F Angas lived at Lindsay Park and J H Angas lived at Collingrove Homestead. Five generations of the Angas clan called Lindsay Park and Collingrove home. Descendants of the Angas family still live in the Angaston area at Hutton Dale Farm.

J H Angas built the Union Chapel in 1844, the Barossa's oldest surviving public building (now restored in Penrice Road) and encouraged the growing of vines and orchards in the valley. The stone arch bridge at the Western end of town was built in 1865 (still in use) and by the 1860s Angaston prospered with a number of churches, a Mechanics Institute (now a B&B and

formally the Masonic Hall), two hotels, police station and court house. The Angas family financed new public buildings and churches, promoting social and cultural life.

Marble has been quarried at Angaston since the 1870s and in particular white and pink marble feature in buildings and monuments in town.

The Town Hall (formally Institute) was built in 1911 (pictured) with the foundation stone reading "This stone was laid by Mrs CH Angas of Lindsay Park Angaston May 24th 1911". A cinema was started here in 1914 and talking pictures in 1931.

The Angaston railway line opened from Gawler through Nuriootpa to Angaston in 1911. The economy of the town prospered after the railway line opened. Regular passenger services operated until 1968 and the last occasional tourist train in 2004. The railway station has now been restored.

Join me for a guided walk of the Angaston main street after our "Outback Morning Tea" on Sunday 3rd April, 2022.


