



Australia's most prolific poet.

Poem by C.J.Dennis

The music of your voice

A vase upon the mantelpiece,

A ship upon the sea,

A goat upon a mountain-top

TOWNS OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA

In this series of "Towns of South Australia" I will explain a brief history of the town and how it got its name. This month we look at Laura

Laura

In the early 1870s Booyoolee Run, a pastoral holding was leased by Herbert Bristow Hughes. In 1872 he surveyed and subdivided the land and named the new town after his wife Laura Hughes. Prior to the establishment of the town the area had a number of large pastoral holdings including Beetaloo Station, a cattle run established in 1844.

Located 20km West of Laura, Beetaloo Reservoir was South Australia's first regional reservoir. It was built between 1885 - 1890 at a cost of 700,000 Pounds and supplied water to Port Pirie, Moonta, Wallaroo and Kadina. It is open 1 May to 1 November and has a picnic area and is stocked with Golden Perch, Silver Perch and Murray Cod.

In 1880 the Bowker family were selling fresh milk and cream from their dairy. In 1923 they established a factory in Laura to produce icecream and Golden North was born. The Bowker family sold Golden North to Farmers Union in 1983. In 2006 Golden North became a "Icon of the state" in the Bank SA Icon of the state awards. In 2008 it was sold to five South Australian families who are the current owners

C.J.Dennis was born in Auburn, South Australia in 1876. His father was a publican and took over the Beetaloo Hotel from 1892 to 1910 and Clarence Michael James Dennis moved with him to Laura and worked in the Hotel for a brief time. C.J. Dennis was first published in the local newspaper the Laura Standard (taken over by what is now The Flinders News) when he was 19. His real fame came with "The Sentimental Bloke", a series of Australian poems. There is a larger than life statue of C.J Dennis in the main street of Laura.

A narrow gauge railway built in 1884 once joined Gladstone, Laura, Stone Hut, Wirrabara and by 1915 to Wilmington. It closed in 1969. A high class rail trail suitable for all mountain and road bikes runs between Laura and Stone Hut.

Located in Hughes Street the classically decorated Court House was built in 1878 (pictured). It was operated as a court house for 90 years, closing in 1968. It is now an art gallery.

UPDATE ON SNAKE BITES

The following appeared in Westprint on 11 February

All snake bites must be treated as potentially life-threatening. If you are bitten by a snake, call triple zero (000) for an ambulance.

How do I provide first aid for snake bites?

Keep calm, and follow these steps:

- Get the person away from the snake.
- Ensure they rest and help them to stay calm.
- Call triple zero (000) and ask for an ambulance.
- Treat immediately don't wait for symptoms to appear.
- Apply a pressure immobilisation bandage (see below).
- Don't wash the bite area venom left on the skin can help identify the snake.
- Do not apply a tourniquet, cut the wound or attempt to suck the venom (poison) out.

Pressure immobilisation bandage

A pressure immobilisation bandage is recommended for anyone bitten by a venomous snake. You should firmly bandage the area of the body involved — such as an arm or leg. If you can't use a pressure bandage because the bite is on the trunk or stomach, apply constant, firm pressure.

Follow these steps to apply a pressure immobilisation bandage:

First, put a pressure bandage over the bite itself. It should be tight and you should **not** be able to easily slide a finger between the bandage and the skin.

Next, use a heavy crepe or elasticised roller bandage to immobilise the whole limb. If possible, mark the site of the bite on the bandage with a pen.


Splint the limb including joints on either side of the bite. Keep the person and the limb completely at rest.

How can I make sure the snake is identified?

Venomous snakes can be identified based on any venom deposited on clothing or the skin. Do not wash the area of the bite, try to suck venom out of it, or discard clothing. Do not try to catch or kill the snake to identify it since medical services do not rely on visual identification of the species of snake. Around 100 Australian snakes are venomous, but only 12 are likely to inflict a wound that could kill you. Australia has about 140 species of land snake, and around 32 species of sea snake. Antivenom is available for all bites by venomous Australian snakes.
