TOWNS OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA

In this series of "Towns of South Australia" I will explain a brief history of the town and how it got its name.

This month we look at Gomersal


The area was initially settled by German families in 1851-54, with a peak population during the 1860's. Originally called Neu (New) Mecklenburg after the town from where most settlers came, the name was changed to Gomersal (after a Yorkshire village which was the birthplace of South Australian Premier Archibald Peake's father) in 1918 during WWI due to anti German sentiment at the time.

Two local congregations were soon established and the Schoenborn Bethleham Lutheran Church was built in 1856, a substantial stone building with walls two feet thick, huge timber lintels and a thatched roof on Schmaal Road. Local farmers supplied 40 bundles of hay each

year for the re-thatching of the roof prior to an iron roof being installed in 1896. This building was used as a school during the week and a church on Sundays (pictured). Originally a Lutheran school, it was taken over as a State school in 1917 and only closed in 1951. Teacher living quarters were added in 1907. This building is still in excellent condition and is a private house. The 1850's cemetery alongside the building is still owned and maintained by the congregation. A new replacement church on Gomersal Road



had its foundation stone laid in 1926 and was dedicated on 30th January, 1927 (pictured). The materials used to build this church were provided by the local residents and it is still in



use with services on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month. The second church, the Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, was built in 1864 on Gomersal Road, replaced with a new church that had its foundation stone laid on the 8th March, 1925, closed in 1970 and demolished due to serious salt damp problems. Only the cemetery remains.

John Dreyer built a general store and post office 1866 - 1930 (Dreyer's Store) on the corner of Gomersal Road and Lyndoch Road (pictured) and supplied the local farmers with a range of goods and had the mail contract to obtain mail thrice weekly on horseback. Dreyer came from Mecklenburg and was a qualified brewer and distiller. Gomersal didn't have an hotel, although it is probable he carried out some form of brewing from the Store as well! Mrs Schmaal was postmistress from 1901 to its closure in 1930.



The Hentschke family moved to the area in 1851.m Their first living quarters was an underground dwelling built of pug with a steep thatched roof. The ruins of the second house, now just rubble, consisted of two rooms built of stone and clay. The substantial present



"Woodbridge", homestead fronting Gomersal behind a large hedge, was built during the 1880's with walls 20 inches thick, a bakers oven and a cellar. (pictured). large ironstone barn was also built around this time. The farm totalled around 400 acres. Second generation Carl Friedrich Hentschke married Maria Amalie (nee Schmerl - and Deb Earl's ancestor) and lived in Gomersal all of his working life, serving as a Lay-reader

at the Schoenborn Church for 33 years, Treasurer for 22 years (one of his last duties seeing the erection of the second and present Schoenborn Church) and a member of the Freeling Council, Gomersal Ward for 12 years. Both are buried at the Gomersal cemetery.

A school picnic was held behind the Hentschke homestead each year. It was apparently a grand occasion, people from near and far attending. The school children marched from the school to the grounds, led by the Neu Mecklenburg Band. A tennis court remains behind the homestead today.

Gold was discovered in 1871 and the "Golden Belt" mine produced over 800 ounces of gold.

Christian Schoff purchased Pindarie farm from the Crown in 1854 for £253. Later it was sold to Friedrich Schwarz who was often quoted as saying "sheep have golden feet" and during the 1890's wool boom built the large bluestone homestead. Pindarie Winery has restored the homestead, stables and the grain store into a classy Cellar Door and food area.

Vines were planted in the area as early as 1887 by the Fromm family and a small winery, Gomersal Wines started producing wine, now known for its full-bodied Shiraz. Wheat and sheep were the areas main industry and now grape vines and cereal farming continue.

Local roads are named after early settlers of Gomersal - Fromm, Heinze, Hentschke, Heinrich, Brock, Schmaal, Hoklas, Lindner, etc.

There is little information on-line or in Barossa history books on Gomersal and I thank local, Margaret Nelder for her assistance in researching this history.

There are now two fully accessible shower blocks, each with six hot water showers and five toilets. A camp kitchen with food preparation and dishwashing facilities is now available (pictured) as well as new picnic furniture and shelters throughout the site. Campsites are now more spacious which will allow campers extra privacy to enjoy the beautiful surroundings. Including some double sites and drive-through sites, bookings are available online.


ANSWER TO "WHERE AM I"

Clare Town Hall

This "new" Clare Town Hall was built in 1925 - 1926 in a simplified classical style by Mayor builder Mr A J Bowley for £6,990 and opened by the South Australian Governor Sir Tom Bridges on 21 April, 1926. It was to replace the smaller Town Hall built in 1866 further South on the main street complete with clock tower, but no clock! (currently the building is being restored.) Four offices are at the front of the building, Council Chambers and Mayor Parlour upstairs, and a large stage, dressing rooms, supper room, kitchen, powerful electric lights and a timber floor which was designed for dancing. Moving pictures were popular at this time and renowned Picture Theatre designer Chris Smith won the contract from 24 entries to incorporate a Picture Theatre into the Town Hall. (His next design was the beautiful Peterborough new Town Hall in 1926-1927 and one of his last; The Capri at Goodwood 1941, not bad for a Carpenter!) At the time it was described as one of the best regional Town Halls in Australia. The outside clock once stood above the J.W. Ohlmeyer Clock, Watch and Jewellery shop and can be adjusted from the upstairs rooms. J.W. (Will) Ohlmeyer was twice mayor of Clare.

1931 saw the introduction of "Talkies" to Australia and new Shadowtone Talkie equipment was installed at a cost of £1,200 and the first "Talkie" 'Half Shot at Sunrise' was shown in September 1931. In the 1950's 300 new theatre seats were installed with Dunlopillo cushioning. Alby Mangels showed his "World Safari" film here in 1980. The Clare Valley Film

Society was still active in 1994.



The Town Hall has been used for many dances, weddings, parties and even the 1950 release of the Rover 75 motor car (priced at £1,175) in front of 500 people. Famous people like Thomas Edmonds and even Kamahl have performed here. The Town Hall was built on the site of a three storey Flour mill that was destroyed by fire. £5,000 damage was done by the fire but insurance only covered £3,800

and it was never re-built. The mill was demolished in 1924 to make way for the new Town Hall. The new Town Hall (pictured) in 1926 (plan) and 2024. Now in 2024 Council and the Hall committee are debating about renovating the stage. option one is to install a lift to the stage, option two is to lower the stage and option three is to turn the stage into a flat stage. New chairs and new lights were installed in 2023.
